TECHNICAL PREPARATION

The IHBC's Virtual School Experience

Different web services, platforms, technical infrastructure and standards mean any webinar features and user options can vary significantly. In general, the more mobile the technology, the more limited the delegate interaction. Checking out in advance the advice below and the systems you will use will help maximise your IHBC 2020 'Virtual School' experience!

Platform Guidance: Gotowebinar

The IHBC's 2020 Virtual School platform is <u>Gotowebinar</u>. The service has a useful list of <u>FAQs</u> for problem solving, so in advance of any School sessions you can usefully at least:

- See how to <u>Join a webinar</u> and what to expect
- Check out the video for <u>delegates</u>
- See the <u>FAQs</u>, and check out linked support and training (some accessed via the free trial)
- Understand the <u>experience</u>, and be sure to use the links for more detail

Wifi/Broadband/Mobile technology

Check out the connections you will use on the day. You can assess your wifi/broadband service connections using <u>Speedtest</u>, or a comparable national service. You should trial it using the technology you intend to use, and at corresponding times of day if possible. If the service is poor it may be better to use your mobile service and/or a smartphone.

- Event feedback outlines from delegates.

IHBC CPD and digital skills and services

As a service from the IHBC, the Virtual School is designed to offer delegates dedicated CPD support opportunities. This School service is planned to advance understanding of digital services and experiences within the core competences of a conservation professional working in a pandemic, or post-pandemic, environment.

The Virtual School's <u>Gotowebinar</u> platform offers extensive support on webinar experiences and problem solving so, in advance of the School as well as after, IHBC CPD hours may be generated.
